The following programs have been found to be non-compliant with one or more of CAMPEP standards and/or policies. These programs maintain their accreditation while these issues are addressed and are required to report on progress towards meeting the standards annually.

- West Physics (Jan 10, 2026)
 - Non-compliance with CAMPEP Policy E.07.09: Failure to provide appropriate documentation (e.g., Annual Reports, Self-Study Renewal, required information on website) to the Chair of the appropriate Review Committee in a timely manner, unless a delay is granted, without approval by the Chair of the Review Committee shall be cause for a program to go on probationary status. Probationary status may be granted by the President upon recommendation from the Chair of the appropriate review committee and shall be for a six-month period. If appropriate documentation is not provided by the Program Director during this period, the program shall lose its accreditation.
 - Non-compliance with Residency Standard 4.7: The program director shall ensure that all resident statistics, annual reports, and other information that is required by CAMPEP are reported accurately and in a timely fashion.
 - Responses to requests for information related to their reaccreditation application have been very slow. The program was placed on probationary status in January 2026, and the status will be evaluated by the Board in July 2026.
- Halifax Radiation Oncology Physics Residency Program (March 29, 2026)
 - Non-compliance with CAMPEP Policy E.07.09: Failure to provide appropriate documentation (e.g., Annual Reports, Self-Study Renewal, required information on website) to the Chair of the appropriate Review Committee in a timely manner, unless a delay is granted, without approval by the Chair of the Review Committee shall be cause for a program to go on probationary status. Probationary status may be granted by the President upon recommendation from the Chair of the appropriate review committee and shall be for a six-month period. If appropriate documentation is not provided by the Program Director during this period, the program shall lose its accreditation.
